Make a smoothie, list all of the fruit being used

Line up all your family members, use comparatives such as taller and shorter to discuss everyone's height

Open a closet door and label ten new items in the closet



Cook a pretend meal using your imagination, talk about each step

Draw a racetrack on your driveway and race all the cars you can find; talk about which car was the fastest and slowest

Make a card for Dad or Grandpa for Father's Day, talk about each step

Label the parts on your family pet (e.g., paws, claws, beak, whiskers)



Read a book with rhyming words, point out the words that rhyme and talk about how they sound the same

Make S'Mores, talk about each step



Visit your local library; check out a book about summer; label five new vocabulary words

Spend five minutes talking about your favorite movie, talk about what happened during the beginning, middle and end

Go on a nature walk and stick items to a bracelet made of tape, compare what each person has when you get home

Set up a lemonade stand; talk about what you will do



Count how many blue cars you see while on your way to the next destination

While in the grocery store play "Alphabet Hunt"; name a letter and see if you can find it in the store



Make paper bag puppets; use them to act out your favorite story

Go on a camping trip in your backyard or living room, talk about putting up your real or pretend tent

Sing, "If You're Happy and You Know It" and change the actions and emotions while singing

Make a birdfeeder with an orange. Visit www.moogcenter.org for language ideas.

Make a bracelet with beads or cereal; count the number of beads and make a pattern

Paint your sidewalks with water; talk about what you are painting and what is happening to the water

Make a pretend pizza with play-dough, talk about what toppings you will put on it



Make an obstacle course; talk about going around, over, next to and between different objects



Label five furniture items in your home

Grab some chalk and play hopscotch outside; practice counting and talk about what you are doing
