







# Language Calendar

<p>Play "Red Rover" outside and call people by what they are wearing, instead of their names</p>	<p>Go for a bike ride; before you leave, label the parts of the bike and what they do</p> 	<p>Find and label five objects that are yellow</p> 	<p>Dip chalk in water and then draw outside with the wet chalk; talk about what you are drawing</p>	<p>Go to the pool; visit <a href="http://www.moogcenter.org">www.moogcenter.org</a> for language ideas</p>
<p>Grab a basket of toys; label ten toys and talk about how you play with them</p>	<p>Go out for lunch and let your child order for him/herself</p>	<p>Build a tower with some blocks; talk about where you are putting each block (on top of, between, in front of, behind)</p>	<p>Make a fruit salad; talk about the types of fruit you use</p> 	<p>Look for worms in the backyard and count how many you find</p> 
<p>Sing "Wheels on the Bus" and do the actions for each verse; add new lines to the song</p>	<p>Go to the zoo and talk about the animals you see and what they are doing</p>	<p>Go shopping for school supplies; label the items as you put them in the cart</p> 	<p>Make Jell-O and use a plastic knife to cut shapes; label the shapes you make</p>	<p>While in the car, name the letters you see on the street signs, buildings, and traffic signs</p>
<p>Wash the car together; talk about each step</p>	<p>Call Grandma and Grandpa on the phone and tell them about your day</p> 	<p>While folding the laundry, make patterns with the clothes, such as <i>sock-shirt-sock-shirt</i></p>	<p>Draw faces on a piece of paper and talk about different emotions (happy, sad, excited, mad, surprised)</p>	<p>Visit your local library; check out a book about going to school; label five new vocabulary words</p>
<p>Blow bubbles and talk about the sizes of the bubbles and where they landed</p> 	<p>Get some paper and crayons and draw a picture of your house; label all the parts of the house</p>	<p>Make lunch; talk about everything you will need</p> 	<p>Play with a baby doll; talk about how you rock, feed, and burp the baby</p>	<p>Go into the kitchen and label all the appliances (oven, refrigerator, microwave, dishwasher, toaster, toaster oven, etc.)</p>
