(Short Answer Example: The correct answer is "Amendments 1-10 are included in the Bill of Rights".)

#### C. Cite where you found the correct answer listed.

(Example #1: I found the correct answer on pg. 13 of the "We The People" textbook.)

(Example #2: I found the correct answer on pg. 11, Ch 4 wkst, in my class notebook.)

#### \*You will have answered A-C (listed above) for EACH incorrect answer on your original test.

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
