Course Description

This is the first semester of World History, so we will be covering events, which occurred between the years 500-1800. The main Lincoln Public School District standards we will be covering are:

Standard 1	 Interactions of Civilizations To understand the development and interactions of empires in the Middle East, Africa, Asia, and Europe between 500-1450
Standard 2	 Global Expansion and Cross-Cultural Exchanges To understand the significant political, economic, and cultural transformation that occurred as a result of global expansion and encounters between 1450-1750
Standard 3.1	 New Global Interactions To understand how political reactions evolved from conflict and new ways of thinking between 1700-1800

You can expect me to prepare classes that appeal to a variety of different learning styles. That means no one class will be the same as another. You can anticipate this course to have daily notes and in/out-of-class assignments, research projects, document analysis, written responses/papers, chapter quizzes, and unit tests.

Homework

You will receive homework in this class that reflects the objectives of this course, practices historical skills, and further develop our understanding of history and the world around us. <u>Homework can be</u> <u>considered formative or summative</u>. **Formative** assignments are ones that help you develop and practice knowledge, a skill, or a certain lesson/unit, i.e. in-class assignments, homework, and study guides, etc. **Summative** assignments are those that test your knowledge on a subject, i.e. quizzes, tests, and research projects.

All homework will have a due date depending on the assignment. Homework not turned in will result in a \underline{Z} in the grade book. In order to get <u>full credit</u> of your assignments you must turn in your homework on time. Late homework will be deducted as shown below.

Homework Passes: You will be given 3 homework passes a semester. Homework passes allow you to "pass" on an assignment without penalty. If you do not use all or any of your homework passes during the semester, you may turn them in for extra credit at the end of the semester.

 \rightarrow Note: There will be certain assignments that you may not use a homework pass on.

Classroom Procedures

1. **Be respectful – to yourself, your peers, your teacher, and your environment.** Be aware of how you approach the people around you, physically and verbally.

2. **Be focused** – Always come to class prepared to focus on the class objectives and lesson activities for the day. Make sure you bring a notebook and utensils to take notes. Please put away any distractions, i.e. iPods/mp3 players, during **instruction** time. Cell phones will **NOT** be permitted, unless permission has been given, and will be taken away.

3. **Tardies/Absences** – LHS tardy and attendance policy will be strictly followed. Each tardy to class will be recorded in Pinnacle and in my attendance book. Your administrator will issue consequences.

4. **Missed Work** – The majority of your missed work and assignments can be pulled from my website. If you need access to a printer, please ask for a pass to the Media Center. However, missed in-class notes will have to be attained from one of your classmates or from me before or after school.

5. Late Work - You can expect to have daily work, in-class assignments and homework, during this course. All assignments given will need to be turned in **by the assigned due date** in order to receive <u>full</u> <u>credit</u>. Points will be docked for late assignments as follows...

6. **Test/Quiz Retakes** – In order to retake you must have all your assignments from that unit turned in. Please refer to my test/quiz retake directions for more directions.

1st Offense: No food for the <u>entire class</u> for one day.

2nd Offense: No food for the <u>entire class</u> for one week.

3rd Offense: No food for the <u>entire class</u> for the rest of the semester.
