Colonies

- A colony is a place that is settled at a distance from the country that controls it
- Following the settlement of Jamestown, more people begin to come to the Americas because of push factors (religious intolerance, lack of opportunity) or pull factors (animals & wildlife & new plant life discoveries like tobacco)

Environment

Diversity

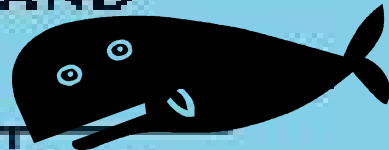
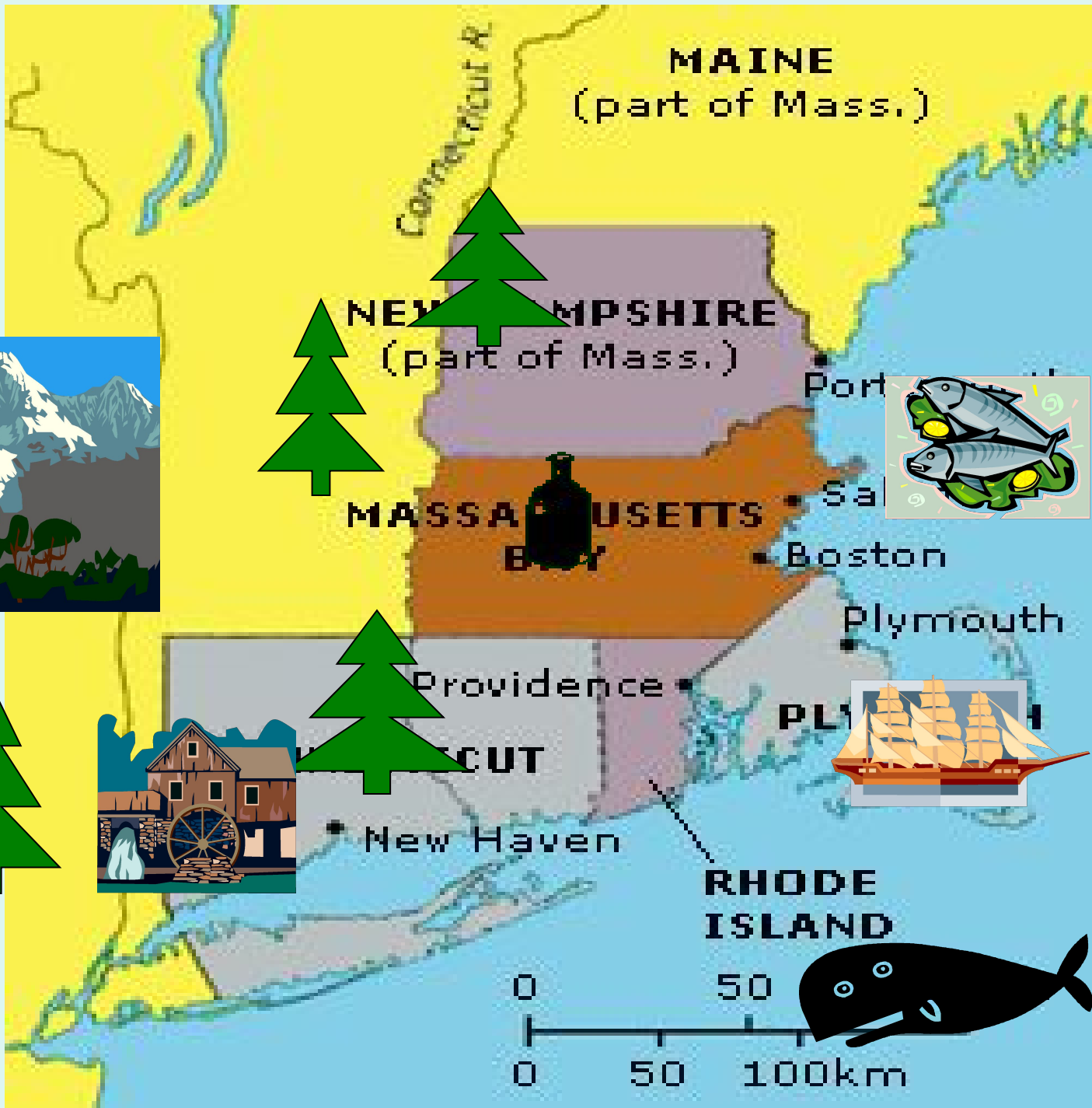
