

# “10 THINGS I WANT TO DO BEFORE I TURN 82”

## POWERPOINT PROJECT

You will be using PowerPoint to create a presentation about yourself. As a minimum, you should have the following included in your slides:

Completed	Elements to be Included	Notes
	<b>Slide 1:</b> Title Slide Project Title and your name	
	<b>Slide 2-11:</b> These slides should each contain one thing that you would like to do before you turn 82. This will give you ten slides, each with one activity/etc. Use at least 3 bullets per slide. One bullet is the activity – the others are why you want to do that activity.	
	<b>Slide 12: Conclusion Slide</b> – At least 5 bullets summarizing your presentation – <del>clapping sound &amp; animated hands clapping – link back to slide 1!</del>	
	<b>Every slide</b> has to have at least one of the following: <i>Picture from Internet OR Clip Art OR Word Art OR Shapes</i> Be sure to <b>use at least one of each</b> somewhere in your presentation.	
	Use a Design Theme of Choice OR decorate the slides nicely so they don't need one!	
	Animate bullets so they enter one at a time (1 <sup>st</sup> level paragraphs)	
	Spelling should be accurate. Use Spell check (Right Click on any wavy red underlines.)	
	At least 3 bullets per slide but no more than 6 bullets per slide,	
	Add a transition between all slides	
	<del>Convert text on one slide to Smart Art Graphic.</del>	
	<del>Add some sound from clip organizer to one of the slides!</del>	
	<del>Insert an Action button on last slide to take you to 1<sup>st</sup> slide</del>	
	Insert a Hyperlink to the Internet on one of the slides	

Be careful in your choice of colors and fonts; your information should be attractive and yet easy to read and understand. Move your text boxes and clipart images around to get the most visually pleasing design. You are encouraged to use the “Notes” feature of PowerPoint so you don't read your slides when presenting it.

**Save as: “10ThingsLastName” to your PowerPoint folder**
