

in *our own pockets* or not, depends no longer on *us*, but on *them*. [As Lord Cambden said,] "There is nothing which" we can call our own; or, to use the words of Mr. *Locke*—"WHAT PROPERTY HAVE WE IN THAT, WHICH ANOTHER MAY, BY RIGHT, TAKE, WHEN HE PLEASURES, TO HIMSELF?"

These duties, which will inevitably be levied upon us—which are now levying upon us—are *expressly* laid FOR THE SOLE PURPOSES OF TAKING MONEY. This is the true defini-

tion of "taxes." They are therefore *taxes*. This money is to be taken from *us*. We are therefore taxed. *Those* who are *taxed* without their own consent, given by themselves or their representatives, are slaves. *We are taxed* without our own consent, expressed by ourselves or our representatives. We are therefore—I speak it with grief—I speak it with indignation—We are SLAVES. . . .
