

GOODRICH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED: OCTOBER 1, 2019-MARCH 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)

To be considered, the applicant must complete and submit the Goodrich application (including ALL required materials) to the Goodrich Scholarship Program by **MARCH 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)**. Applicants who will have earned more than 31 college credits by May 2020 are NOT eligible for the Goodrich scholarship. **ONLY United States citizens or legal non-citizens of the United States who are residents of Nebraska are eligible for this scholarship.**

Required Goodrich Application Materials:

- ❑ 1. **Goodrich Scholarship Information Form.** The applicant must complete and submit the Goodrich Scholarship Information Form online at <http://goodrich.unomaha.edu> by the **March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)** application deadline. The application process opens **OCTOBER 1, 2019** and ends **March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)**.
- ❑ 2. **University of Nebraska at Omaha Application for Admission.** Goodrich Scholarship Program applicants must complete an Undergraduate Application for Admission to UNO by **March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)**. Applicants must follow the online instructions at <http://www.unomaha.edu/admissions/apply/undergraduate/index.php> or call UNO's admissions office at 402.554.2393 for UNO admission assistance. Goodrich applicants must meet UNO admission criteria and be admitted to UNO prior to acceptance by the Goodrich Scholarship Program.
- ❑ 3. **Official Reference Forms.** Goodrich Scholarship Program applicants must submit TWO official reference forms completed by teachers, counselors, employers or other professionals who are **not family members or friends**. Each applicant is solely responsible for verifying that the Goodrich Scholarship Program receives the two references by the **March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)** deadline (check online application for updates). Reference forms are part of the online application process <http://www.unomaha.edu/college-of-public-affairs-and-community-service/goodrich-scholarship-program/apply/index.php>.
- ❑ 4. **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).** Goodrich Scholarship Program applicants must establish financial need through the FAFSA. To complete the FAFSA, go to <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov> and follow the online instructions, or call UNO's Financial Support and Scholarships Office (402.554.2327) for further financial aid assistance. Final verification of an applicant's financial status is determined by the UNO Financial Support and Scholarships Office. Upon completing the FAFSA, applicants **MUST** provide Goodrich with proof of completion (through e-mail, fax/scan, or USPS mail) before the **March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)** deadline. To accommodate the **March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)** application deadline and to enable Goodrich to *preliminarily assess* the applicant's financial need, the applicant can complete the 2020-2021 EducationQuest College Funding Estimator online at <http://www.educationquest.org/college-funding-estimator>. All pages of this estimate must be printed out and submitted to the Goodrich Scholarship Program before the **March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)** deadline. *Note: The applicant must still complete and process all documents for the FAFSA before Goodrich can award any scholarship.*
- ❑ 5. **English Placement and Proficiency Exam (EPPE).** The UNO Testing Center manages this free test which must be taken and processed ONLINE **before the March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST) deadline**. To take the exam online, applicants MUST have their UNO NetID Credentials (username and password). Note that this UNO NetID is not the 8-digit number but is created after applying to UNO using parts of your first and last name. THIS online PROCESS can take SEVERAL days, so it is imperative to PLAN AHEAD. **The FINAL ONLINE EPPE TESTING DATE for Goodrich applicants is February 21, 2020.** For additional information, visit the UNO Testing Center website at <https://www.unomaha.edu/enrollment-management/testing-center/placement-exams/english-placement-proficiency-exam.php> or call UNO's Testing Center at 402.554.4800.
- ❑ 6. **Transcripts AND ACT/SAT scores.** The applicant must submit high school (or GED) transcripts, ACT/SAT scores, and any college transcripts to the Goodrich Scholarship Program by the **MARCH 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)** application deadline. Goodrich will accept ACT/SAT scores included on the applicant's high school transcript. Note: Transcripts required as part of UNO's Undergraduate Application for Admission process cannot be faxed and must be sent directly from the high school to Undergraduate Admissions. Goodrich cannot request transcripts from UNO's Admissions Office.

Only after completing the six steps above and submitting the required online application materials by **March 1, 2020 at 5:00PM (CST)** will a Goodrich applicant's file be complete and eligible for consideration. Eligible applicants with complete files will then be invited for an on-campus interview and asked to write a personal essay.
