### MTSS-B Kindness Lesson Data November 12

98.7% of teachers participated in teaching this lesson.

Overall, the feedback from students was positive and 83.3% of surveyed students stated that they enjoyed the lesson.

- 82.2% of students said they were generally kind to themselves, and 99% of students stated they were generally kind to others.
- 78.5% of students reported that generally, LSW students are kind and inclusive.

In November, <u>56</u> students were nominated by teachers and staff.
